# Preparing for Your Visit Emotional Care

## **Keepsakes**

Keepsakes are objects that are kept in memory of this pregnancy. All keepsakes are free.

- Footprints-the doctors may be able to obtain footprints
- Memory box-a small box where you can put ultrasounds, footprints and other objects related to this pregnancy
- Memory stone-a beautiful agate stone as a symbol of remembrance
- Ultrasound images

#### Autopsy/Genetic Testing

Your doctor can talk to you about the information autopsy and genetic testing can provide in your unique situation.

#### Autopsy

- A pathologist (a doctor who specializes in the study of human diseases and their causes) uses surgical techniques to examine the body and individual organs.
- Throughout the process our pathology team works with the utmost professionalism, treating the body with dignity and respect while observing the family's wishes.

#### Genetic testing

- Genetic testing helps identify genetic problems which may have caused problems with this pregnancy.
- Genetic testing can be performed even if you chose not to have an autopsy.

## **Burial/Cremation**

At the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania, we offer two options for burial/cremation. Our team can discuss this with you in more detail and address all questions and concerns.

## Option 1: A private burial/cremation you will arrange with Pastoral Care

All cultures, religions and spiritual traditions are served by Pastoral Care.

With this option

-you will work with an experienced chaplain to make arrangements -you will be able to keep the ashes or decide when/where the remains are buried -there may be a charge for this service

## Option 2: Burial/cremation at Ivy Hill cemetery arranged by the hospital

All cultures, religions and spiritual traditions are respected by Ivy Hill cemetery.

## With this option

- -the hospital will make all of the arrangements
- -you will not be able to keep ashes or decide when/where the remains are buried
- -you can visit the University of Pennsylvania plot at Ivy Hill, if you wish
- -this service is free

# <u>Memorial Service</u>

The hospital hosts a candle lighting memorial service for our families every October. The service is intended for people from all religions, cultures and spiritual traditions. If you are interested in attending this memorial, a member of your healthcare team will take your contact information.
